▶ Introduction

Certonal® FC-746 is a clear, low viscosity inert hydrofluoroether solvent. The solvent is nonflammable, has low toxicity and provides acceptable environmental properties. It contains no volatile organic compounds (VOCs). It is intended for dilution of Certonal FC-742 and can also be used to remove FC-742 from substrates.

Certonal FC-746 is intended to be used in the dilution of Certonal FC-742 in applications requiring lower solids concentration or to dilute Certonal FC-742 concentrate.

Certonal FC-742 can also be removed with Certonal FC-746 from a localised area, using a brush, or by immersing the substrate in a tank of Certonal FC-746.
